 - At Home Learning Update: PEC wrapped-up 13 weeks of remote learning for students, teachers and families. Teachers have shared that they have built a new type of connection with students and a deeper understanding of who they are as learners and as individuals.
 - **Summer Learning:** Prioritized groups of students will have opportunities for Summer Remote Learning for the next five weeks. All PEC students will have access to learning menus for Anytime, Anywhere Learning and access to digital programs through July.
 - Middle School: The Middle School team has completed the Summit Learning Program New Teacher Modules.
 Learning focused on the student and teacher experience, family engagement and curriculum.

	■ Social Emotional Learning: We continued to invest planning time to develop a comprehensive support plan for students and staff in the fall focusing on staff training, SEL explicit instruction, direct student and family counseling, and focus on DEI and trauma-informed practices. PEC: b. Recruitment and Enrollment: Recruitment and Enrollment efforts are taking place at all of our campuses. PEC hosted their first Virtual Open house on June 2nd and was a huge success c. Grants: PEC's application to the Michigan State Police for the 2020 Competitive School Safety Grant Program is on hold due to state funding. We are continuing to source more grant for PEC including the Dollar General grant submitted for \$4000 ■ DS Relief Fund (MI Region): We've sent \$100 gift cards to 14 PEC families. We continue to raise funds and distribute support to all of our campuses. To date we've raised over \$8000. We relaunched the camping to provide Summer Support to families still experiencing hardships due to the pandemic.	
Comments from the Board	Nicholas Hood asked about the meal preparation at PEC. Is it still continuing? Yes, we are still continuing - participation has been a little low. Rev. Hood suggested looking at Gleaners to pick up the fresh produce and food to cook on themselves. Currently partnering with Trader Joe's to provide food options for families.
